WTCC Core Leadership Team meeting

- Next Governors' call on Tuesday (tomorrow) with Nicholas Giraldo and ET. Plan to ask whether Governor has active plan to stockpile PPE and tests.
- ET discussed financial statement he has posted on Slack. \$25,394.84 remaining in account at present. The largest proportion of expenses have gone to PPE. ET proposes to reimburse UW Makerspace for supplies it contributed. Tyler says the 30 WTCC-related Makerspaces are producing more than the similar Colorado-based Make4COVID program, which has several orders of magnitude more people. In addition, we produce custom designs which they don't. Decision not to return unused grant funds now in case second wave hits in the fall.
- Tyler Kerr to be the engineer on WYSTEM this week. There was discussion of how students can submit 3D printer projects and other logistical issues.
- Moonshot Project: ET will be looking for new volunteer group to undertake request from Governor to assess contact-tracing software. Nicholas and ET to report back to Lois Wingerson about government responses to testing report and spreadsheet.
- ET has call Thursday with Workforce Services about possible hire of full-time community manager using CARES funds.
- Article in Laramie *Boomerang* stemming from Wyoming Community Foundation featured WTCC PPE production.
- Discussion of WTCC future role in that few people in WY seem to be taking the risk seriously. Tyler Kerr says the Makerspace plans to continue stockpiling PPE, just in case.
